The enigmatic Hewitt does not conform with the fisherman lifestyle. He will do anything to get out.








Zé Arroz is a leader in the community. He will introduce to the soldiers the tough yet rewarding life of a fisherman.

He has adapted in the community while falling for Ze Arroz's daughter, Marisol who shows him a new approach to life. They will become a critical turning point in the story.






Amaral is an exploiter of the natives. A dangerous man who's dominance is threatened by the two soldiers.

Four years later, Hewitt's life raft is discovered by a commercial fishing boat.






His son Rodrick, receives the news that his father may be alive and embarks on a journey in search for him.

## **SHORT SYNOPSIS**

British Colonel Edward Hewitt's life is forever changed by a family tragedy. It's1982. Hewitt is ordered to lead twenty soldiers on a high risk mission to the Falkland Islands. When the plane crashes in the ocean, the enigmatic colonel and a young lieutenant are the sole survivors. Rescued by native Brazilian fishermen, they are taken to a remote village where Hewitt is confronted by his past and his willingness to fulfill his military duty while stranded amid the eccentric inhabitance.
